**Niue National Strategic Plan 2016-2026 Launched**

Alofi, Niue, 20<sup>th</sup> October 2016: The Premier of Niue, Hon Toke Talagi launched the Niue National Strategic Plan 2016-2026 during his speech to the nation on the Flag Raising day.

The Plan is published both in the Vagahau Niue and English and the vision of Niue ke Monuina – A Prosperous Niue continues.

The mission is Working Together to Protect the People and the Environment and the important principle is “Tānaki Leveki Puipui Anoiha” which means to Build Preserve Protect for the Future. He said the commitment within the strategic plan is positioned to encourage economic growth and the emphasis is to fully reflect the Governments vision of “A Prosperous Niue” and the mission “Working Together to Protect the People and the Environment.”

The Premier said the Government is focusing on the seven national development pillars that are fundamental to achieving the vision of Niue ke Monuina.

- Finance and Economic Development
- Governance
- Infrastructure
- Social Services
- Environment and Climate Change
- Tāoga Niue
- Private Sector

The seven pillars and strategies is to ensure every resident on the island receives the best possible opportunities and Government services as well as the infrastructure and development mechanisms to ensure the goals are achievable.

Honourable Premier Talagi said, there is a significant contribution to the economy from the private sector and these are also highlighted in the plan to strengthen and support private sector growth.

He said that not all of the pillars are expected to be achieved in a single year, but provide the strategies upon which priorities will be set towards prosperity. Each Government department and agency will have priorities aligned to the Plan and will be measured annually through the national budget process.
